A Rationale for Summer Reading

- To generate interest and pleasure that enriches literary and philosophical experience
- To prepare for thoughtful discussion and writing beginning the first day of class
- To encourage a lifelong love of reading
- To use time not available during the school year to read classics that expand cultural literacy

Required Texts

- *The Strange Case of Dr. Jekyll and Mr. Hyde* Robert Louis Stevenson ISBN-13: 978-0486266886

In this novel, set in Victorian England, Stevenson uses the framework of a mysterious thriller to explore the problem of evil and man's dualistic nature.

- *Educated* Tara Westover ISBN-13: 978-0399590504

Educated tells the story of Westover's ultra-religious upbringing and her struggle to resolve the tension between loyalty to family and her desire to reach her potential and find fulfillment as an academic and an intellectual.

- *What Are People For?* Wendell Berry ISBN-13: 978-1582434872

Berry writes with skill and grace about the things that matter most to him: justice, integrity, hard work, honesty, our natural resources, what it means to be human. The essays in this volume are diverse in style and subject matter but are tied to one another by their wisdom, wit, and clarity.

General Instruction

1. Annotation of books is strongly encouraged; margin notes, highlighting, and summaries are valuable.
2. Students should bring all summer reading books the first day of class.
3. All writing assignments are due the first day of class.
4. Students will test over the works on the first day of class. Essays, seminars, and journals will focus on summer reading during the first few weeks of class.

Specific Writing Instructions

Write two thesis statements each for *The Strange Case of Dr. Jekyll and Mr. Hyde*, *Educated*, and *What Are People For*.
